A memorable tour of North East Study Circle

Educational trips serve ample of experiences, including enhancing class room learning, promoting social and emotional development, exposing students as well as teachers to real life situation. The aim of the study tour, of course, is to learn and gain new skills and knowledge. Study tour actually takes someone beyond the class room so that hands –on learning experience can be gathered in a single umbrella. Short listing two or three destinations is much more beneficial for the group to acquire knowledge in real sense. The journey of our North East study tour was scheduled to start on 1st October towards Prayagraj and we reached our destination on 3rd .We then directly rushed to Triveni Sangam for a holy bath and came back to Pranta Kendra Vidyalaya i.e. Jwala Devi Saraswati Vidya Mandir. The place was a beautiful one with magnificent natural views with mesmerizing sunset. Then we reached our next destination i.e. Satna, Madhya Pradesh where we knew that a great example of humanity and empathy waiting to be learnt for the group. We visited Saraswati Sishu Mandir at Krishna Nagar where a programme was organized by Purva Chatra Ki Sahabhagita. It is praiseworthy that the school is governed and run by the alumni of the school itself. A legendry example of alumnus Tripti, who narrated the great contribution of the ex-students who were ready to help her for higher study in abroad but later on she, managed a scholarship with her own capacity. A memento of Hanumanji was given each and every members of the group with a high tea. From there we headed to Janajati balika Chatrawas, Majhgawan, a sweet home for many girls from nearby villages of 40-50 km. range. There was a huge statue of ‘Maharani Durgawati’ gracing the entrance. Our next destination was Chitrakoot, where our night stay was at ‘Deendayal shodh Sansthan’, Panchwati.



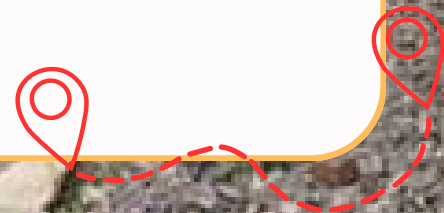
✓ On 4th, we proceeded towards Deendayal Research Institute, where we spent the first half of the day with various activities like 'Ram darshan' where we witness a mammoth of Hanumanji, followed by a beautifully decorated museum of Sri Ram chandra's life with equally divided five different parts. The museum was well decorated with splendid paintings of some famous artists. That was followed by 'Nanhi Duniya' just near by the museum, which is practically a pre-primary school. It was well decorated the different angles like, a small swimming pool, mini zoo and a large map of India etc. It was really an all facilitated provision for early childhood teaching process through which a child could easily acquire early learning knowledge in a proper way. So we proceeded towards the enormous statue of Deendayalji, where his views were quoted in various dimensions like family life, importance of education etc. After that we visited 'Udyamita Vidyapeeth', where a production cum training centre that consisting of various industrial sheds like mustard oil extraction, jam and pickle making, wheat flour grinding and garments department etc. We attended a session of Avnishji, General Secretary of Vidya Bharati. Then we visited Chitrakoot Gramoday University where we attended a seminar. The seminar was organized on the occasion of 500 birth anniversary of Maharani Durgavati and the speakers were Tai Tagakji, advisor to Chief Minister of Arunachal Pradesh, Avnish Bhatnagar and Pawan Sthapak. Tai Tagakji quoted the term, Namaste North East and explained the meaning 'Namaste' with alphabets, N for Nagaland, A- Arunachal, M-Manipur, Meghalaya & Mizoram, A-Assam, S-Sikkim, T-Tripura and E for education and cultural trip.

Thereafter, we visited the 'Gaushala' where only Indian breed cows were kept and it is very interesting to know about that the gaushala was running by its earning of the products like milk, urine, cow dung and it followed by its by product like medicine, shampoo etc. Then we visited 'Chitrakoot Ras Shala' which is a house of Ayurvedic pharming that markets at least 35 ayurvedic products like chyavanprash, Aloe vera etc. That was followed by short introductory information by Deendayal institute's officials in a nearby auditorium.



The next day i.e. on 5th October was a really an auspicious day for us because we had an opportunity to celebrate the 500 years of birth anniversary of Maharani Durgavati. Before attending the meeting we had an uncommon breakfast at Deendayal Shodh Sansthan's janjati chatrawas where Janajati students also seated beside us during our breakfast. On the occasion of commemorate of Rani Durgavati, a book was released which was penned by A.D.N. Vajpayee along with recitation of a few poems by himself. After that programme, we explored the Kalinjar fort, from where we enjoyed a beautiful scenic beauty. Then we proceeded towards Chhatarpur and spent our memorable evening in and around the statue of Maharaja Chhatrasal. We were surprised to know that the entire cost of the statue was provided by ten lakhs of family contributing ten rupees each. Then we proceeded to La capital hotel where the trust members of Chhatrasal Maharaj organized a meeting on the occasion of annual memorial get together and they felicitated our entire group with a beautiful memento. Had our dinner in the same hotel and then boarded on train for our next destination Ujjain.

On 6th October, we reached Ujjain and directly went to Samrat Vikramaditya Bhavan (Malwa prant Karyalaya). Just after the breakfast we had an opportunity to witness the different sections like, Department of primary education, computer section, social media along with seminar hall and conference hall. Then we went to pay our heartfelt respect to Mahakaal Mandir, which followed to nearby Bharat Mata Mandir. There after we visited to Madhya Pradesh Tribal Museum in Bhopal which was well decorated with replica of tribal houses of the Gond, Korku, Bhil and Sahariya tribe. Besides these it also displayed tribal spiritual world, tribal housing, and gallery of various life style with a painting section and library. After a patient observation the nooks and corner of the museum, we proceeded to our night stay at Sarswati Vidya mandir, Sharda Vihar prakalp.

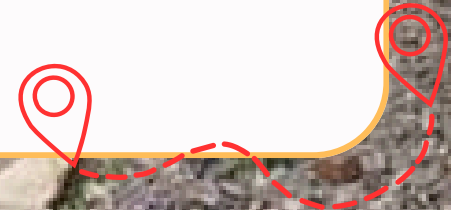




The very next day i.e. on 7th October, we roamed in and around the entire premises and surprised to see well designed Vidya mandir with science garden, school hostel, swimming pool, Gaushala and energy generating electricity plant and so forth. Then we proceeded to Jabalpur but on our way to that destination, we visited Bhau Saheb Bhuskute Smriti Prakalp, Bankhedi where we observed the organic cultivation of paddy field and another point of attraction was varieties of birds which were kept for feeding purposes of that crops. Then we reached Vidya Bharati Mahakoushal prant, Jabalpur for our night stay and it was well managed.

On 8th October, after having our breakfast in the school we visited Radha Krishna mandir followed by Chausath Yogini Mandir. After that we went to Dhuandhar waterfall, Bhedaghat which was really an amazing view for all of us. Thereafter, we rushed to Dada Virendra Puriji Eye Institute where we had a short get together followed by lunch. The eye hospital was meant for poor and especially for the welfare to the tribal communities. During eye treatment patients were provided food and lodging with free of cost and it covers the tribal people of sixteen districts of Madhya Pradesh. Then we reached Vidya Mandir to attend our valedictory function, where each and every speaker became emotional as our educational tour came to end. Then we went to Central Academy and the authority of the school arranged a beautiful cultural programme to welcoming 'NAMASTE' North East group which followed by dinner. Thereafter, we directly proceeded towards railway station for our return journey to Guwahati.

Educational tours are essential in promoting lifelong learning and personal growth. They provide a platform for experimental learning, promoting personal development, and foster socialization and community building.

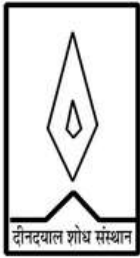

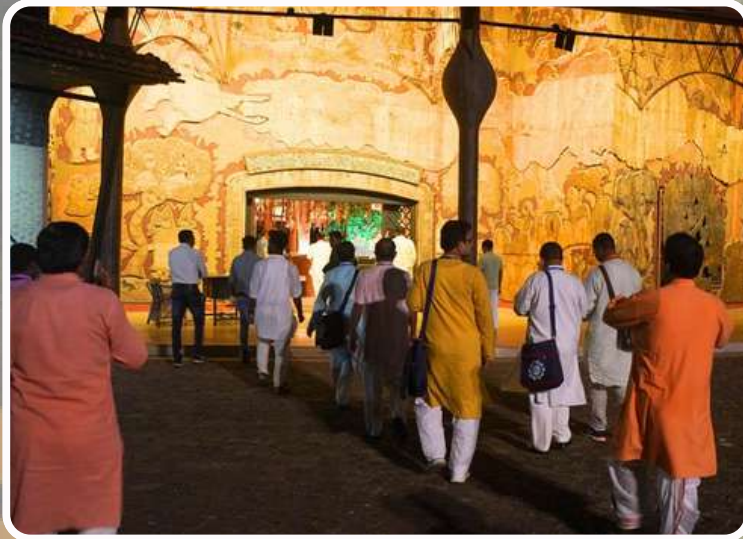
